## About CHIP

**The Coalition for Homelessness Intervention and Prevention's (CHIP) mission is to mobilize, advocate and empower community collaboration toward the elimination of homelessness and foster an effective system of homelessness prevention and intervention in the greater Indianapolis area.**

We work to end and prevent homelessness in the greater Indianapolis area. This requires coordinating an effective community-wide response to the issue of living without stable housing. Our role is unique as the lead entity implementing the *Blueprint to End Homelessness*, our community's strategic plan to end homelessness. We work to move forward initiatives outlined in the *Blueprint* through collaboration, education, awareness, resource development and data collection.

### Youth Homelessness

#### **Did you know that approximately 3,000 children experience homelessness each night in Indianapolis?**

That is a staggering number of children who do not have stable housing. According to the point in time count CHIP conducted on January 21, 2010, 362 children under the age of 18 were reported as living in emergency or transitional shelters. The local schools also reported 2,972 students were living in shelters, motels or hotels or doubled-up with family or friends.

CHIP and our many partners are working hard to gain a better understanding of youth homelessness in Indianapolis and identify ways in which the community can effectively address their needs. If we end and prevent homelessness for our youth today, they have a better chance of leading an independent and sustainable life tomorrow.

## Community Development



### Point In Time Count

CHIP conducted a comprehensive point in time

homeless count in January 2010 with the assistance of IUPUI students, SPEA and community volunteers. The count reported that 1,488 individuals experienced homelessness that night and nearly 40% were members of a family.

### Annual Homeless Persons' Memorial Service

On December 21, the community honored 36 homeless neighbors who passed away in 2010 at Christ Church Cathedral. The annual National Homeless Persons' Memorial Service is traditionally held on the first day of winter to remember those who have experienced homelessness and passed away in the last year.

## Collaboration

### Blueprint Celebration

The Blueprint Celebration recognized individuals and organizations who made an extraordinary impact on moving forward the initiatives of the *Blueprint* in 2010. The annual event was held at the Conseco Fieldhouse where Diamond Award winner Donnie Robinette, HIP outreach team leader, inspired the community with his experience of homelessness and how he has given back over the last 15 years.



### Indy Homeless Connect

On March 23, 2010, CHIP, along with over 650 volunteers, held the fifth annual Indy Homeless Connect at the Indiana Convention Center. More than 1,069 men, women and children made connections leading to improved health, self-sufficiency and the opportunity to create a home for themselves and/or their families.



# Community Progress



## Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP)

Supported by the 2009 federal stimulus, HPRP provides emergency funding to social service agencies to assist individuals and families at risk of homelessness to maintain their homes or to be rapidly re-housed after entering shelter. CHIP was tasked with integrating the required data management components into the continuum's Homeless Management Information System (HMIS), training new users in data collection, performing data quality audits and generating reports to show how funding was used and in what ways it supported homeless prevention efforts in the city. The HPRP program ended its first year on September 30, 2010. The prevention programs served 490 households, representing 1,271 individuals, and the rapid re-housing programs served 402 households, representing 751 individuals.

## Community Outreach Task (COT) Force

The Marion County Mental Health Court and Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department (IMPD) partnered in 2009 to provide a homeless mental health outreach collaborative called the COT Force. In addition to representatives from IMPD and the courts, key staff from 16 social service agencies working with homeless neighbors participate in the task force. This group works together to better serve individuals with mental illness by reviewing current practices, coordinating and applying existing resources to serve specific clients and identifying long-term resources to cultivate for homeless mental health outreach. In 2010, the COT Force identified 41 people to work with who are homeless, have a high number of law enforcement encounters and mental health and/or substance abuse issues. Of those 41 individuals, 16 people have been in treatment or off the street resulting in decreased arrests and public health costs. The COT Force received a 2010 Blueprint Champion Award recognizing their effective partnership and positive intervention for individuals suffering with mental health and/or substance abuse issues.

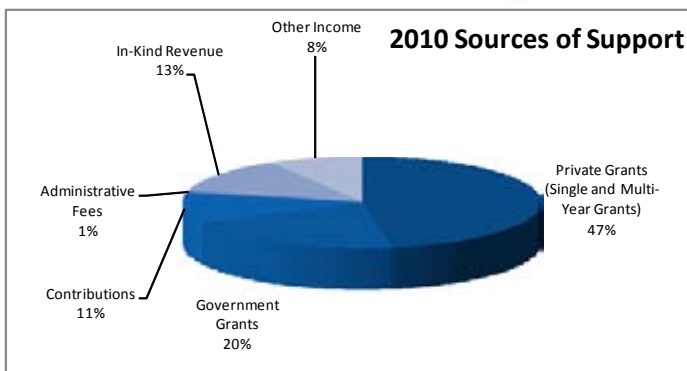
## Homeless Outreach Training

In 2010, CHIP facilitated the creation of Consensus Standards for Community Outreach. Homeless outreach teams from eight different agencies, in conjunction with the IMPD, collaborated on consensus standards for homeless outreach and engagement. Those standards are under review for endorsement and recognition as a best practice. In addition, The Indy Dream Center worked with the IMPD and community stakeholders to develop a training curriculum for outreach workers, new police officers and others who provide outreach to or encounter unsheltered homeless individuals. The curriculum encompasses and coordinates public safety, public health and outreach. The first training was held in October 2010 and additional classes will be ongoing.

## Engagement Center

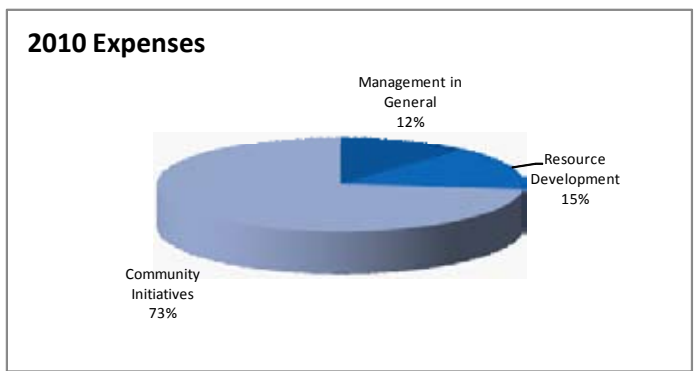
CHIP utilized a grant from the Marion County Low Income Housing Trust Fund to support the development of architectural renderings, cost modeling and site evaluation and analysis on viable properties that could serve for locations for an Engagement Center, a facility providing emergency care, safety and social engagement for publicly intoxicated individuals who do not have a home. CHIP convened meetings of the Engagement Center Task Force, neighborhood associations and community partners to advance this initiative and secured operational support in 2010.

## Housing Trust Fund

Since 2006, the Marion County Low Income Housing Trust Fund has invested \$6.5 million into housing projects yielding 282 units of affordable housing and services for homeless neighbors.

## Permanent Supportive & Transitional Housing

The 2010 inventory indicates that there are currently 1,063 units of permanent supportive housing (including 826 units created after the *Blueprint* was adopted), and 438 units of transitional housing. There are another 128 units of permanent supportive housing and 28 units of transitional housing in the pipeline, meaning that they are scheduled to be developed and come on line prior to the end of 2012.

## 2010 Advocacy Council
